Dear Fellow Members,

Last month we welcomed a new full member to the club. Three other families also joined our wait list. This sign of financial soundness is a pattern that this club has maintained for some time now. And like Federer when he's up, we are in a period of calm command. This is a good time to keep our eye on the future and keep our feet planted.

Over the past nine years, we've spent an average of about \$80k per year on minor upgrades and repairs. We project spending about the same amount per year in the future. Some of the needs we know we have are a new roof, four of our seven furnaces need replacing and the plumbing in the main building needs upgrading.

Our club master plan puts highest priority on maintenance, but frames them so that we can leverage improvements and make logical upgrades while continuing with maintenance.

During the process we've asked you what matters most. We discovered items beyond maintenance and how you would like your club to look, feel and act. We've all had a chance to dream a little. Your responses covered everything from better, healthier food to making the upstairs more functional, improving the pool deck and making the basement more functional.

We are only starting to figure out what these upgrades would mean financially. On November 10 at 6:00 pm in the Irvington Ballroom, we will have an open meeting to share and listen to what we've learned and talk about the potential approaches to advancing the club into our future.
